- The Department recommends going abroad during the junior year or second semester sophomore year. Senior year is possible if students do their thesis in their Junior year.
- To receive History credit for any courses taken abroad, you must have the courses approved by the Department of History before you take them. Normally courses taken abroad must be listed as History or offered through the History department at your host institution abroad in order to qualify for History credit at AU. Retroactive approvals will only rarely be given. Should classes close prior to your arrival at the host institution, you need to submit approval requests via e-mail to the Director of Undergraduate Studies in History before registering for additional classes.
- History majors can count up to 19 credit hours of courses taken abroad toward their major course requirements.
- To have a course pre-approved requires the submission of a detailed course description and preferably a full syllabus in English to the Director of Undergraduate Studies in the Department of History, along with your study abroad course form.
- If you are interested in studying abroad, please let your academic advisor know as soon as possible so you can set up a schedule of classes that completes all the degree requirements and includes your study abroad experience.
