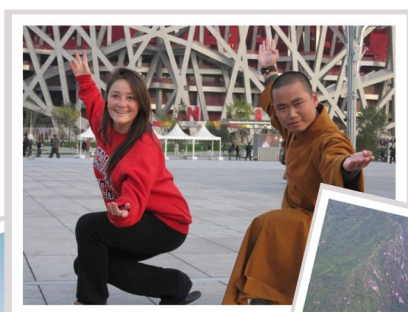

- If you are interested in studying abroad, please let your academic advisor know as soon as possible so you can meet to discuss study abroad goals and how they fit into your specific academic program and graduation requirements.
- Generally, students may study abroad between their second semester of sophomore year through their junior year. The decision when to study abroad should be made in consultation with the student's academic advisor.
- Students majoring in Graphic Design are encouraged to study abroad during the fall semester of their Junior year or during the summer to maintain the proper sequencing of the coursework in the major.
- To have courses approved students must submit course descriptions, along with the completed course equivalency form, to their Program Director for approval.
