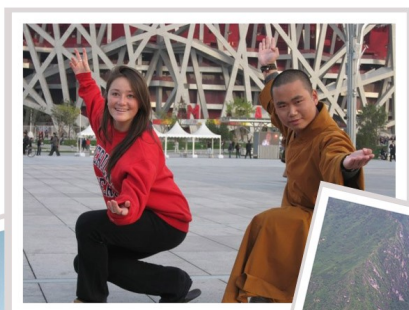

- Students may study abroad between their second semester of sophomore year through their senior year. The decision when to study abroad should be made in consultation with the student's academic advisor, to ensure it fits with their academic program.
- If you are interested in studying abroad, please let your academic advisor know as soon as possible so you can set up a schedule of classes that completes all the degree requirements and includes your study abroad experience.
- Justice majors can count up to 6 credit hours of pre-approved courses, taken while abroad, toward their upper-level major course requirements.
- To have a course "pre-approved" requires the submission of a detailed course description and syllabus if possible. Its highly recommended that you schedule an appointment with your faculty in -advance and do not expect immediate approval of a course upon request.

STUDY ABROAD FOR JUSTICE MAJORS

Australia

University of Queensland (UQ)

Located in Brisbane, widely known as Australia's most liveable city, UQ is one of the top research universities in Australia with over 38,000 students from 124 countries. You can choose from over 25 courses focused on criminology and criminal justice.

Canada

Carleton University

Carleton is widely recognized as one of the top universities in Canada. Centrally located in the Canadian capital of Ottawa, it draws 18,000 students to its wide range of course offerings. Carleton is especially well known for its expertise in public affairs and has a strong program in criminal justice.

University of Toronto

University of Toronto is Canada's premier university. In 1963 the Centre of Criminology was established at the University of Toronto, the first of its kind in Canada. Currently, there are twenty undergraduate Criminology courses and approximately 500 undergraduates enrolled in the program. Toronto, affectionately known to Canadians as "the city of imagination," is one of the most diverse cities in Canada and is home to more than 100 cultures.

Denmark

DIS

Denmark's Institute for Study Abroad is internationally renowned as well as recognized, supervised, and financially supported by the Danish government. Students have the opportunity to learn about the criminal justice system in Scandinavia through courses taught in English by the some of best faculty available. Copenhagen, Scandinavia's largest city, was founded in 1167 and is filled with world class museums, ancient cobblestone streets, and the enchanting Tivoli Gardens.

England

King's College London

Study right in the heart of London at one of the most prestigious universities in the UK. Students have the ability to immerse themselves in the study of criminology, criminal justice and the history of crime and the law.

London School of Economics (LSE)

LSE offers a unique opportunity to study the social sciences in a university institution with a worldwide academic reputation. LSE's Program in Social Policy and Criminology allows students to take courses such as Criminal Justice Policy, Comparative and International Social Policy, or Psychology of Crime and Criminal Justice. Students must study for a full academic year at LSE.

Netherlands

Leiden University

Leiden University is the oldest university in the Netherlands and has an enrollment of over 16,000 students. Located about 30 minutes from Amsterdam and 10 minutes from the Hague by train, Leiden offers wide range of courses in law, political science, and psychology.

New Zealand

University of Auckland

Study in New Zealand's largest city, Auckland, and discover this unique country! The University of Auckland is a prestigious center of academic excellence and one of New Zealand's largest and most important research institutions. Learn about the justice system of New Zealand and how it impacts the indigenous population.

Victoria University of Wellington

Study in New Zealand's capitol city of Wellington at, Victoria University! The University was established in 1899 and teaches about 18,000 students every year. The three campuses that make up Victoria University are all within walking distance of each other and span Wellington's compact city center. Victoria is the only university in New Zealand to offer Criminology as a major for a degree.

South Africa

University of Capetown

The University of Cape Town (UCT), founded in 1829, is the oldest university in South Africa. The Centre of Criminology at UCT initiates, co-ordinates and develops research and extension services in the broad field of criminology. Since 2007 the core focus has become that of African Security and Justice Project.
