- Students may study abroad between their second semester of sophomore year through their senior year. The Literature Department recommends that students study abroad during their junior year.
- If you are interested in studying abroad, please let your academic advisor know <u>as soon as possible</u> so you can meet to discuss your study abroad goals and how they fit into your specific academic program.
- Literature majors can count up to six credit hours of <u>pre-approved</u> courses, taken while abroad, towards their upper-level major course requirements. Additional courses under consideration for credit must be pre-approved by the Director of Undergraduate Studies.
- Courses are approved on a case-by-case basis so it is highly recommended that you schedule an appointment with the Literature Department to discuss course equivalencies in advance.
 Please be sure to submit a detailed course description and syllabus for each course with your request.
