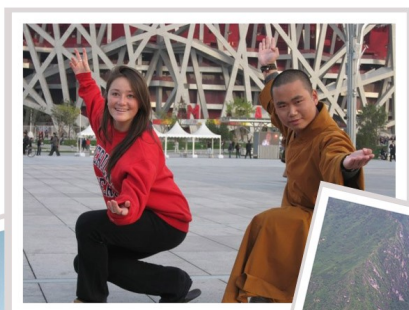
Sociology Guidelines for Study Abroad

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- The Department of Sociology recommends students study abroad in the fall and/or spring semester of their junior year. All core courses for the major/major must be completed within the Sociology department **on campus**, including senior seminar the spring of their senior year. Students need to consult with their academic advisor, to ensure the timing of their study abroad fits into their academic program.
- Sociology allows up to **9 credits** of approved **elective** courses for a major/minor when students study abroad. No core courses for the major/minor are allowed to be taken at another institution. Students studying abroad commonly take courses for SOCY credits that are particular to the culture of the country in which they study.
- Sociology is not a term used in all countries and students often receive elective credit for their major/minor in courses labeled as "anthropology," "social psychology," "cultural studies," and "social science."
- To have courses approved students must submit course descriptions, along with the completed course approval form to professor Andrea Brenner.
- If you are interested in studying abroad, please let your academic advisor know as soon as possible so you can meet to discuss study abroad goals and how they fit into your specific academic program and graduation requirements.
